



## Adding layers in ArcGIS Online

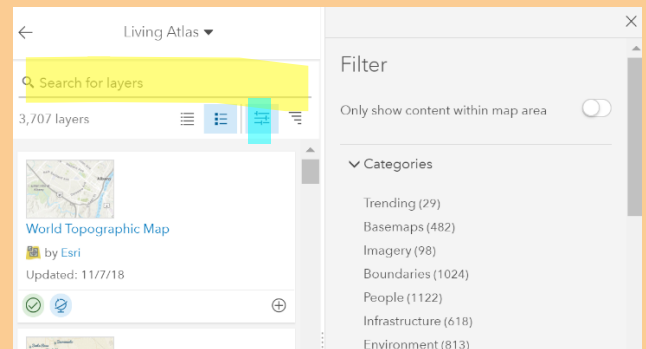
### Option One: Living Atlas

The ArcGIS Living Atlas of the World is the foremost collection of geographic information from around the globe. It includes maps, apps, and data layers to support your work.



### Adding layers from the Living Atlas



1. Press the  button, and select Browse Living Atlas
2. You can search for a term in the **search** bar or **filter** by category or country
3. If you want to find out more about a layer, you can click on it for more information
4. To add to the map, simply click the  icon in the bottom right hand corner

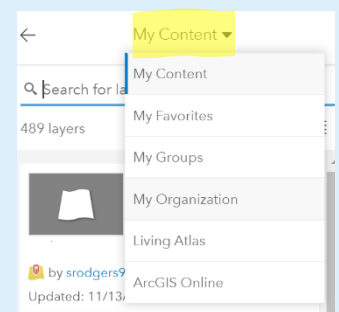


### Option Two: ArcGIS Online

ArcGIS Online allows you to search public layers created by a wide variety of organisations and people. It is important when searching these layers to consider reliability.

### Adding layers from ArcGIS Online

1. Press the  button, and select Search for Layers
2. From the **drop down**, choose ArcGIS Online
3. To add to the map, simply hit the  icon in the bottom right hand corner

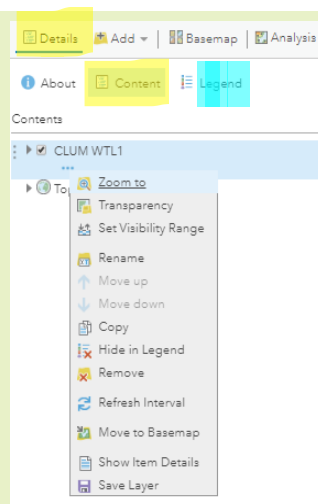


### Working with your layers

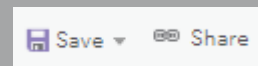
To see the layers you have added, click **Details** > **Content**.

Here you can turn layers on and off, delete them, rename them or change the transparency.

You can also see the Legend by selecting the **Legend** button.



### Saving and sharing your layers



To save your layers, press Save > Save As. Give your map a **TITLE** and a **TAG**.

To share your map, press Share. Select Public and share your map via the URL.
